### The Lesson:

We begin this new season with two Feast days: Pentecost, and then Trinity Sunday. Then we move into the long season known as Ordinary Time, which runs until Advent in November. As we take this journey, nourished by the Bible stories chosen for the season and empowered by our baptisms, we are invited to be on the lookout for all the blessings found in the ordinary—to see God at work here and now. And we are compelled to share our blessings with others. Today's theme is "Come Holy Spirit."

Leader: A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Jesus' disciples were celebrating a festival called Pentecost when suddenly a strong wind blew through the house. Everyone's hair lifted up and there was and amazing noise! They looked at each other. It looked like each disciple had a flame of fire touching him, but no one was burned. The Holy Spirit had come, just as Jesus promised! The disciples began to speak in different languages! All: Jesus, Hear our prayer.

**Confession:** Remain kneeling and repeat after the leader.

All: Dear God / I am sorry that I have done things, / and I should not have done. /

I ask you to forgive me / for hurting friends and those I love. /

Please help me to do better. / Thank you, God, for your love. Amen.

Leader: Thank you God for hearing us. / We know that you forgive us. /

We know that Jesus loves us. / We know that the Holy Spirit /

Keeps us in God's care. Amen.

All: Oh, Lord Jesus, I praise you this day. / I give myself to you this day /

I ask you to help me this day. Amen.

Thank you, God, for sending Jesus to bring peace to the world.

Leader: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

# **Activity**

This activity is best enjoyed outside where bubbles will hurt nothing and children can run. Invite the children to help you make bubbles. Blow some bubbles first and ask them what they notice about what happens to the bubble. (It gets bigger when you are blowing on the liquid, it floats away, the wind carries it, etc.) The wind in our story blew through the room within the disciples and reminded them of God's presence with them. In the wind, they could feel the Holy Spirit.
