Leader:

Collect for Purity:

The Lesson: All sit.

We are now in the long season known as Ordinary Time, the green season after Pentecost which runs until after Thanksgiving. As we take this journey, we are invited to be on the lookout for all the blessings found in the ordinary—to see God at work here and now. In Ordinary Time we will probably encounter some out-of-the-ordinary events in our own lives and possibly even in our life together as the Cathedral Family. The gift of this time is finding the hidden blessings amid the ordinary occurrences. And we are asked to share our blessings with others. Today's theme is "What Does it Take to Get Into the Kingdom?"

Leader: A Reading from the Gospel according to Mark.

A man who owned many things and had lots of money comes up to Jesus. The man is used to being able to get whatever he wants. He asks Jesus how he can be sure he gets into heaven. Jesus knows this man knows the Ten Commandments, so Jesus tells the man to follow those rules—rules like don't kill anyone, don't tell lies, and obey your parents. The man feels very proud of himself because he is sure he does all these things. Jesus sees that the man is proud of following all the rules, but was still unhappy, so Jesus says, "Well, what you really need to do is sell everything you have and give the money to poor people." That made the man sad, because he loved all his fancy things, so he just went away.

Leader: This is the end of the lesson so I say: The Word of the Lord. And you say:

All: Thanks be to God.

Children's Creed: All stand.

All: We believe in God, who made us and made everything. We believe in Jesus Christ,

who is God's son. We believe in the Holy Spirit, who helps us grow. Amen.

Prayers of the People: All kneel.

Leader: We pray for our clergy: Dean Beverly, Father Eric, and everyone in the church.

All: Jesus, hear our prayer.

Leader: We pray for the leaders of the world, so we can live in peace.

All: Jesus, hear our prayer.

Leader: We pray for our families, that Your love may fill our hearts

All: Jesus, hear our prayer.

Leader: We pray for the boys and girls and their families who are hungry, and we give thanks for those who

help them.

All: Jesus, hear our prayer.

Leader: We pray for all people who are sick or sad.

All: Jesus, hear our prayer.

Leader: We pray for all who have died.

All: Jesus, hear our prayer.

Leader: We ask all these things in the name of your Son, Jesus Christ.

All: Jesus, hear our prayer.

Confession: Remain kneeling and repeat after the leader.

All: Forgive us Lord, for the things we have done

that were not kind and good. Forgive us Lord, and help us try to do the things that we should. Amen.

Leader: Thank you God for hearing us. We know that you forgive us.

We know that Jesus loves us. We know that the Holy Spirit keeps us in God's care. Amen.

Closing Prayer

All: Oh, Lord Jesus, I praise you this day. / I give myself to you this day /

I ask you to help me this day. Amen.

The Peace

We offer each other a sign of God's peace for one another.

Leader: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All: And also with you.

At this time we will continue up the stairs to Sunday School.

At the proper time, we will process back into the church to join our parents for the rest of the service and Holy Communion.
